

RADM Sinclair Harris US Navy retired currently serves as the senior executive director for Navy Business Development at ManTech, International.

He retired as a rear admiral (upper half) after a 34-year career in the U.S. Navy. Both a CRUISER/DESTROYER and AMPHIBIOUS Warfare or "GATOR SAILOR", RADM Harris has served in nearly every ship type. During his time in service he commanded at every

level including Commanding Officer of USS COMSTOCK (LSD 45), Commander Amphibious Squadron FOUR/IWO JIMA Strike Group, Commander, Expeditionary Strike Group FIVE, and Commander, US Fourth Fleet/Naval Forces South. He has served in peace and war during his career including: Cold War deployments, Operation Desert STORM, Operation Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom, Defense Support to Civil Authority (hurricane Katrina and Rita), Humanitarian Support to Pakistan (2010 Floods), Non Combative Evacuation Operation (Lebanon 2005), and numerous other multinational exercises.

During his career, he served in a wide number of assignments ashore both overseas and in Washington D.C on both the OPNAV and Joint Staff. His last assignment was as the vice director for operations to the chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.

Sinclair Harris holds a BS from James Madison University in Economics, a MS from Naval Postgraduate School in Operations Analysis, Defence Services Staff College (Tamilnadu India) in International Relations and Defence Studies. He is also from both Chief of Naval Operations Strategic Studies Group and MIT Seminar 21.

RADM Harris continues his support for the Sea Services in his voluntarily roles as immediate past president of the National Naval Officers Association, national vice president of the Navy League of the United States, board member of the Navy Marine Corps Relief Society, board member Navy Federal Credit Union, and on several other non-profit boards supporting Sea Services and their families. He was awarded the 2022 Vice Admiral Samuel L. Gravely Leadership Award from the National Museum of the Surface Navy (Battleship IOWA) and the US Coast Guard 2022 Distinguished Public Service Award.
